The Gardena Valley Japanese Cultural Institute (GVJCI) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit community center providing various classes, programs, services, and facilities to the South Bay area. We also provide affordable housing through the JCI Gardens Apartments, the adjacent senior housing property.

The GVJCI's roots date back to 1912, when it was known as the Moneta Gakuen, a Japanese language school. In 1967, it was formally incorporated as the Gardena Valley Japanese Language School. Then, in 1968, the corporation changed its name to the Gardena Valley Japanese Cultural Institute to incorporate the broader services and functions the organization offers. In 1971, Compton Gakuen, Gardena Gakuen, and Moneta Gakuen merged, opening its doors officially as the GVJCl's Japanese Language School. The GVJCl has a very proud history spanning over 100 years.

Today, we continue to provide a variety of activities, programs, and services. We are truly fortunate to have an active and well-utilized center serving people of all ages. We thank you, the community, for your active participation and for your support through donations and volunteerism that enables the GVJCI to continue

#### DONATIONS TO GVJCI

Recently, the GVJCI received a generous donation from Heishiro Otani: a farmer in the Torrance, CA area and a survivor of Rohwer Concentration Camp in Arkansas during World War II. At this camp, he met and became fascinated by artists, Henry Sugimoto's paintings and drawings, and with the woodcarvings of Harry Genji Koizumi. This led to a "hobby" in woodcarving, that he pursued for the rest of his life.

Thanks to a contact from Heishiro's grandniece Diana Ono, the GVJCI was connected to Heishiro's daughter Keiko Otani, as she was liquidating his estate. This included numerous carvings, some several feet in size. His home in Palos Verdes was a veritable museum of his art, beginning with a stunningly carved wooden front entrance. Heishiro never sought profits from his art, and freely donated them to family, temples and institutions. Keiko and her brother Joji, understood their father's intentions and




in that spirit have generously donated a half dozen of Heishiro's wood carvings to the GVJCI. The pieces carved at Rohwer will be shown online during the GVJCI's Day of Remembrance program in February of 2022. Eventually, Heishiro's carvings will be part of a permanent display upstairs, in the tokonoma of the GVJCI building.



# SENIOR FOOD BOX DISTRIBUTION TRAFFIC SAFETY **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Regarding our monthly Senior Food Box Distributions that take place on the first Wednesday of the month, we would like to inform the public about traffic instructions when lining up to receive a box. To ensure the safety of all food box recipients, GVJCI volunteers, and staff, we ask that you adhere to the following instructions. A map is also provided for your reference.

- 1. Adhere to GVJCI traffic volunteers at all times.
- 2. All recipients must line up on 162nd Street heading east toward the GVJCI north driveway. Stay parked on the curbside until the line begins moving. 162nd Street is a busy street -- when in line, please keep your vehicle as close to the curb as possible and avoid lining up

in the middle of the street. DO NOT block resident driveways and intersections.

- 3. Additional traffic to line up heading north on Haas Avenue, turning right on to 162nd Street.
- Enter GVJCI entrance on 162nd. Adhere to GVJ-CI traffic volunteers who will signal you to enter the parking lot. Drive SLOWLY at all times.
- 5. Stay in line after receiving your food box. Wait for volunteers to signal that it is safe to exit. Exiting prematurely increases the risk of injury to volunteers and staff. All cars will exit at the same time by volunteers and staff.
- Exit on Gramercy Place by making a RIGHT turn only.

#### REMEMBER:

- Please DO NOT line up on Van Ness Avenue OR line up west of Haas Avenue on 162nd Street.
- Please DO NOT line up OR try to access the line from Wilton Place or Taylor Court.




