

KITCHEN 2.0! Dale Inafuku, Facility Operations Manager

We had a fire in the kitchen of the GVJCI Nisei Veterans Memorial Hall (NVMH) on October 9, 2016, causing smoke damage throughout the building and the kitchen to need repair and remodeling. This displaced the Tomo No Kai bento program and made our programming difficult. Renters of the NVMH had to deal with not having the use of a kitchen and other activities ceased. We had to come through this better, so a plan was developed to rebuild the kitchen as a fully functional commercial kitchen. It took over a year of drawing up the plans, developing a budget, raising startup funds, dealing with different government agencies, but the plans finally got approved and construction started in December of 2017. We received our final approval from the Los Angeles County Department of Health this summer. It took a long time to complete the project, but it only takes one look to know that it was completely worth it. Happily, the senior lunch program has moved back to the NVMH kitchen and is putting it through its paces! We are hoping that the kitchen will be a major benefit in our hall rentals, and also is used in some new innovative programming.

We need to thank our general contractor Bruce Kato for all the work he did for us on this project. He provided us with enormous amounts of guidance, sprinkled with patience. Thank you for everything, Bruce! Thanks also to all of Bruce's subcontractors for the top notch work they did. Everything from ceiling to floor (and a little above and below that) had to be redone, refitted, and replaced. Awesome job, guys! Finally we want to thank all our donors for their belief in us that we would honor their monetary donations with something we can all be proud of. Thank you one and all!






