The Gardena Valley Japanese Cultural Institute (GVJCI) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit community center providing various classes, programs, services, and facilities to the South Bay area. We also provide affordable housing through the JCI Gardens Apartments, the adjacent senior housing property.

The GVJCI's roots date back to 1912, when it was known as the Moneta Gakuen, a Japanese language school. In 1967, it was formally incorporated as the Gardena Valley Japanese Language School. Then, in 1968, the corporation changed its name to the Gardena Valley Japanese Cultural Institute to incorporate the broader services and functions the organization offers. In 1971, Compton Gakuen, Gardena Gakuen, and Moneta Gakuen merged, opening its doors officially as the GVJCl's Japanese Language School. The GVJCl has a very proud history spanning over 100 years.

Today, we continue to provide a variety of activities, programs, and services. We are truly fortunate to have an active and well-utilized center serving people of all ages. We thank you, the community, for your active participation and for your support through donations and volunteerism that enables the GVJCI to continue.



Why Hokkaido?

Hokkaido, the northernmost island, is Japan's great wild frontier. It's huge, accounting for \(\frac{1}{4} \) of Japan's landmass, but with only 4\(\frac{1}{4} \) of its population. There are enormous national parks, vast primeval forests, a rugged coastline, rivers, volcanic peaks and lakes, hot springs, pure white snow. Hokkaido is the homeland of the Ainu, Japan's indigenous people. Hokkaido's high quality food and drink is unlike anywhere in Japan; there's Seafood caught in its cold, nutrient-rich waters (Crab, Salmon, Mackerel, Oysters, Scallops, Sea Urchin, Squid). 80% of Japan's wild salmon is from Hokkaido. Its produce is known throughout Japan: strawberries, apples, pears, grapes, wheat, and the Yubar Melon, known for its intense sweetness. Hokkaido is Japan's breadbasket. Its dairy products are considered world-class and are highly sought after; the milk is rich and creamy, that results in extraordinary ice cream, butter, cheeses, and yogurt. Many dishes have a pat of butter, e.g., grilled scallops. Hokkaido is crazy for its delicious Ramen: Miso, shoyu, shio (salt), and curry. Beer (Sapporo, of course) and whiskey (world-class Nikka whiskey, awarded the World's Best Blended Malt four times). Hokkaido is the onsen (hot springs) capital of Japan. Its volcanoes create some of the best onsen in Japan.

Why Autumn

Experience Hokkaido's beautiful and colorful fall foliage, and taste its seasonal produce when it's freshly harvested.

Why Winter?

Hokkaido in winter is astonishingly beautiful. It is known for Sapporo's world famous winter snow festival, with its massive snow and ice sculptures. Taste Hokkaido's tremendous seafood. Hokkaido also has fantastic skiing, snowboarding, and other winter sports.
